Dear Fathers, Brothers and Sisters,

The gift of the New Year 2017 has been given to us by our God who became man. Let us receive it with joy, hope and thanksgiving. Let the Mother of our God continue to bless us and protect us. I offer my heartfelt wishes of peace of the New Year 2017 to every one of our priests, religious and the people of our diocese. May the New Year bring blessings of prosperity, joy and happiness.

Before I go further, I would like to express a deep sorrow on the death of our Honorable former Chief Minister, J. Jayalalitha. The entire Tamil Nadu, why the entire nation has lost a leader who dedicated her life to the people of Tamil Nadu for about thirty years. May her soul rest in peace. At this juncture we also assure our prayers to our Honorable former Chief Minister M. Karunanithi for his speedy recovery and good health.



It was painful to receive the death news of Rev. Fr. A. Robert. He had worked several years in our diocese. Due to problem of Visa, he had to go back to Sri Lanka. Though he had several problems, he was doing his priestly ministry there. Due to sickness he passed away on 11.12.2016. Let us continue to pray for the repose of his soul.

On early morning on 23 December 2016, we received the sad news of the death of Rev. Fr. J. John Valarkott. It was indeed shocking. The diocese of Vellore has lost a faithful and dynamic priest. From very young age he had dedicated himself fully to the mission and youth of the diocese. He used education as a source and means of empowering our people. Hundreds of teachers remember him fondly. He streamlined education, he empowered the families of teachers by having several developmental projects especially housing. He had always been faithful to the bishops and collaborated with him generously. We offer our thanksgiving and assure him of our prayers and fond memories. May his soul rest in peace. We do remember with gratitude his parents, brothers and sisters, all his relatives. May his missionary journey continue in us.

The nation is undergoing painful changes. Our people who are very poor, landless labourers are suffering very much due to demonetization. We can only assist them with our prayers and closeness.



As the New Year dawns, the Holy Father invites everyone, especially the world leaders to work for peace in the world. Peace is the only true direction of human progress and not tensions caused by ambitious nationalisms nor conquests of violence, or expressions which serve as mainstay for a false civil order. He warns the international communities of the danger of believing that international controversies cannot be resolved by the ways of reason that is by negotiation founded on law, justice and equality but only by means of deterrent and murderous forces. The Holy Father instead takes his predecessor Saint John XXIII to his assistance who extolled the sense of love and peace founded upon truth, justice, freedom and love.

Pope Francis finally takes a thought from the Father of our Land, Mahatma Gandhi. He affirms 'Non-violence' as a style of politics for peace. He prays 'God to help all of us to cultivate non violence in our personal thoughts and values. It is indeed a thought that makes us all proud. Though our country is pushed to violence, untruthfulness, bribery and deceit, our free India has inherited non-violence as a platform of life. Christmas and New Year should take us back to our roots. Father of Nation has sacrificed everything to achieve our freedom through non violence. Every Indian, especially a Christian is to practice this especially in our individual, personal, family and social life.

While the last century knew the devastation of two deadly World Wars, the threat of nuclear war and a great number



of other conflicts, today, sadly, we find ourselves engaged in a horrifying *world war fought piecemeal*. It is not easy to know if our world is presently more or less violent than in the past, or to know whether modern means of communications and greater mobility have made us more aware of violence, or, on the other hand, increasingly inured to it.

In any case, we know that this “piecemeal” violence, of different kinds and levels, causes great suffering: wars in different countries and continents; terrorism, organized crime and unforeseen acts of violence; the abuses suffered by migrants and victims of human trafficking; and the devastation of the environment. Where does this lead? Can violence achieve any goal of lasting value? Or does it merely lead to retaliation and a cycle of deadly conflicts that benefit only a few “warlords”?

Violence is not the cure for our broken world. Countering violence with violence leads at best to forced migrations and enormous suffering, because vast amounts of resources are diverted to military ends and away from the everyday needs of young people, families experiencing hardship, the elderly, the infirm and the great majority of people in our world. At worst, it can lead to the death, physical and spiritual, of many people, if not of all. Jesus himself lived in violent times. Yet he taught that the true battlefield, where violence and peace meet, is the human heart: for “it is from within, from the human heart, that



evil intentions come” (Mk 7:21). But Christ’s message in this regard offers a radically positive approach. He unfailingly preached God’s unconditional love, which welcomes and forgives. He taught his disciples to love their enemies (cf. Mt 5:44) and to turn the other cheek (cf. Mt 5:39). When he stopped her accusers from stoning the woman caught in adultery (cf. Jn 8:1-11), and when, on the night before he died, he told Peter to put away his sword (cf. Mt 26:52), Jesus marked out the path of nonviolence. He walked that path to the very end, to the cross, whereby he became our peace and put an end to hostility (cf. Eph 2:14-16). Whoever accepts the Good News of Jesus is able to acknowledge the violence within and be healed by God’s mercy, becoming in turn an instrument of reconciliation. In the words of Saint Francis of Assisi: “As you announce peace with your mouth, make sure that you have greater peace in your hearts”.

To be true followers of Jesus today also includes embracing his teaching about nonviolence. As my predecessor Benedict XVI observed, that teaching “is realistic because it takes into account that in the world there is *too much* violence, *too much* injustice, and therefore that this situation cannot be overcome except by countering it with *more* love, with *more* goodness. This ‘*more*’ comes from God”. He went on to stress that: “For Christians, nonviolence is not merely tactical behaviour but a person’s way of being, the attitude of one who is *so convinced of God’s love and power* that he or she is not afraid to tackle



evil with the weapons of love and truth alone. Love of one's enemy constitutes the nucleus of the 'Christian revolution'". The Gospel command to *love your enemies* (cf. *Lk 6:27*) "is rightly considered the *magna carta* of Christian nonviolence. It does not consist in succumbing to evil..., but in responding to evil with good (cf. *Rom 12:17-21*), and thereby breaking the chain of injustice".

Peacebuilding through active nonviolence is the natural and necessary complement to the Church's continuing efforts to limit the use of force by the application of moral norms; she does so by her participation in the work of international institutions and through the competent contribution made by so many Christians to the drafting of legislation at all levels. Jesus himself offers a "manual" for this strategy of peacemaking in the Sermon on the Mount. The eight Beatitudes (cf. *Mt 5:3-10*) provide a portrait of the person we could describe as blessed, good and authentic. Blessed are the meek, Jesus tells us, the merciful and the peacemakers, those who are pure in heart, and those who hunger and thirst for justice.

This is also a programme and a challenge for political and religious leaders, the heads of international institutions, and business and media executives: to apply the Beatitudes in the exercise of their respective responsibilities. It is a challenge to build up society, communities and businesses by acting as peacemakers. It is to show mercy by refusing to discard people, harm the environment, or seek to win



at any cost. To do so requires “the willingness to face conflict head on, to resolve it and to make it a link in the chain of a new process”. To act in this way means to choose solidarity as a way of making history and building friendship in society. Active nonviolence is a way of showing that unity is truly more powerful and more fruitful than conflict. Everything in the world is interconnected. Certainly differences can cause frictions. But let us face them constructively and non-violently, so that “tensions and oppositions can achieve a diversified and life-giving unity,” preserving “what is valid and useful on both sides”.

I am happy once again to wish you all a very Happy New Year 2017.

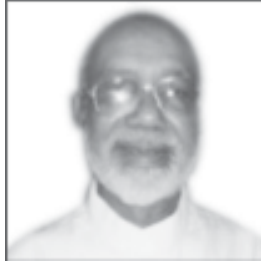
